




Antique Lord Bury 4 Draw Telescope, English, Leather, Steward, Victorian, C.1870

This is an antique Lord Bury 4 draw telescope. An English, leather and brass terrestrial or astronomical refractor by J.H. Steward of London, dating to the Victorian period, circa 1870.
